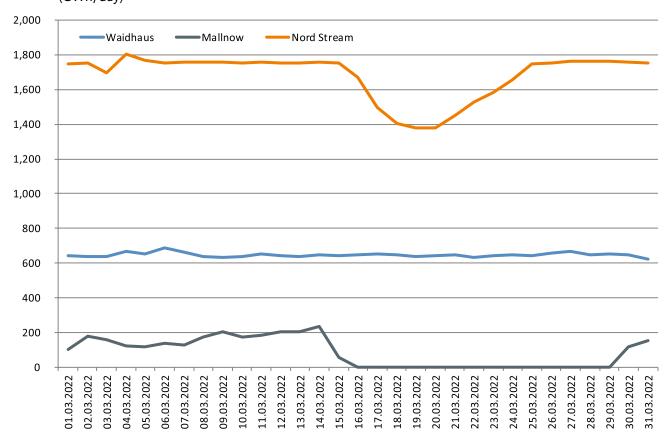
- · The gas supply in Germany is stable.
- Gas network operators have not reported any incidents. No disruption to gas deliveries to Germany
 has been recorded.
- Storage facilities are filled to levels comparable with those in 2021 and 2017 and now significantly
 higher than in 2018. Since 18 March 2022, more gas has been injected into storage than withdrawn
 from it overall.

1. Delivery situation from Russia

- Entry Nord Stream 1: constant entry flow at high level.
- Entry Waidhaus (transit Ukraine): constant entry flow.
- Entry Mallnow (transit Belarus): light entry flow recently.

Gas flows from Russia

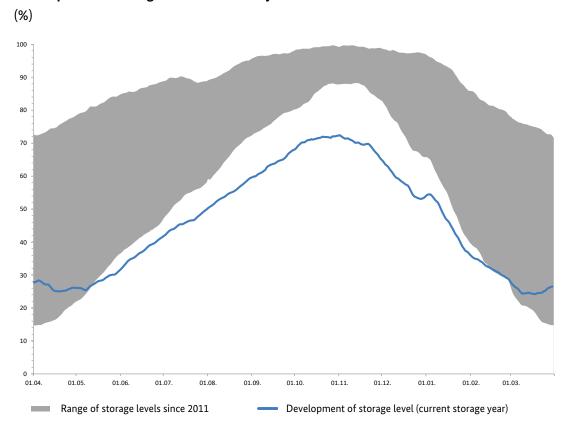

2. Storage levels

- Since 18 March 2022, more gas has been injected into storage than withdrawn from it overall
- 31 March 2022, 6.00am: 64.53 TWh (26.5%)
- Current storage levels are comparable with those in 2021 and 2017 and now significantly higher than in winter 2018

Development of storage levels in Germany¹



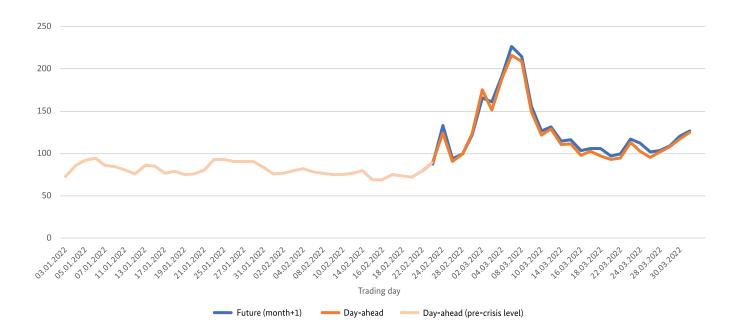
