



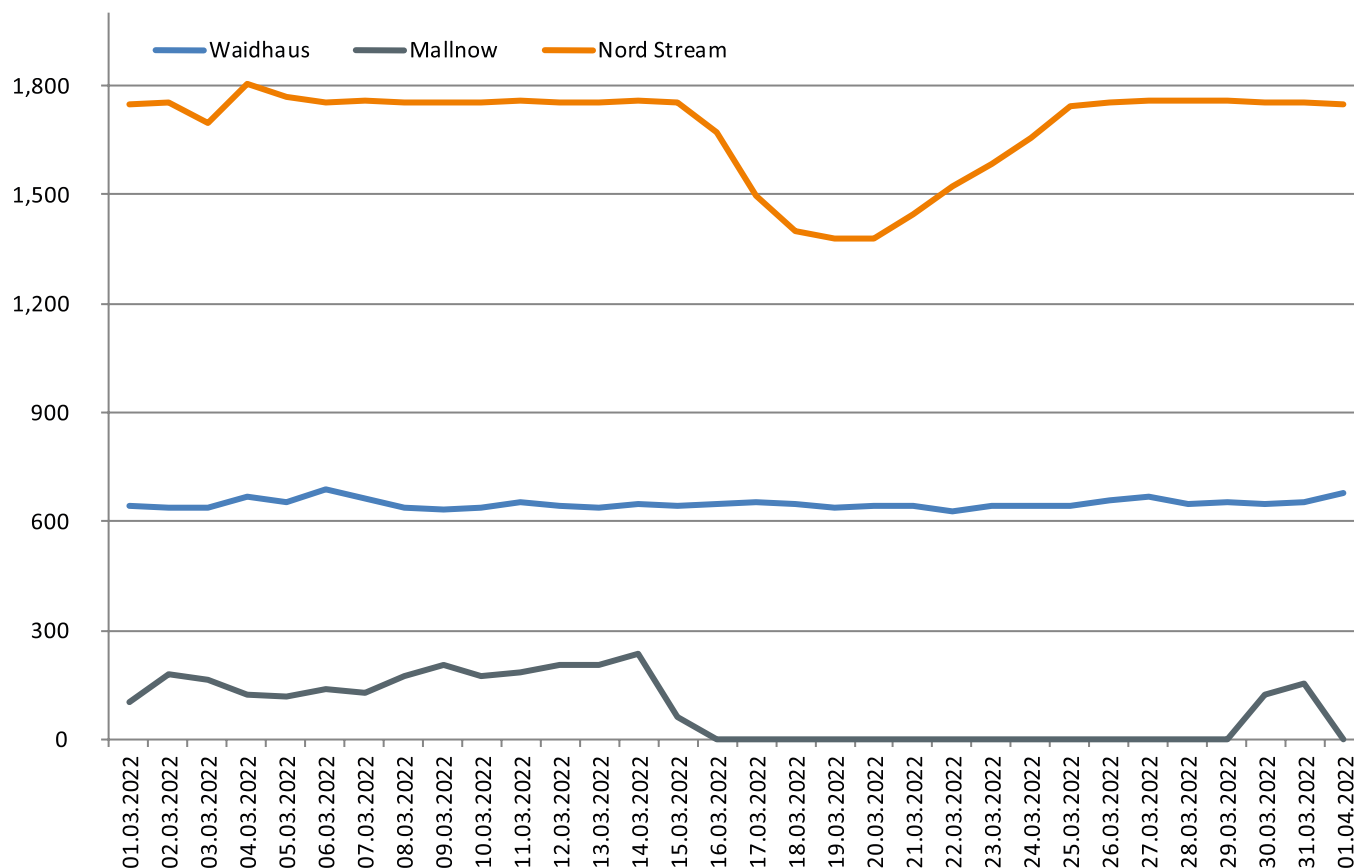
Gas supply status report

As at: 2 April 2022

- The gas supply in Germany is currently stable.
- No disruption to gas supplies has been recorded at present.
- Storage facilities are filled to levels comparable with those in 2021 and 2017 and now significantly higher than in 2018. Since 18 March 2022, more gas has been injected into storage than withdrawn from it overall.

1. Delivery situation from Russia

(GWh/day)

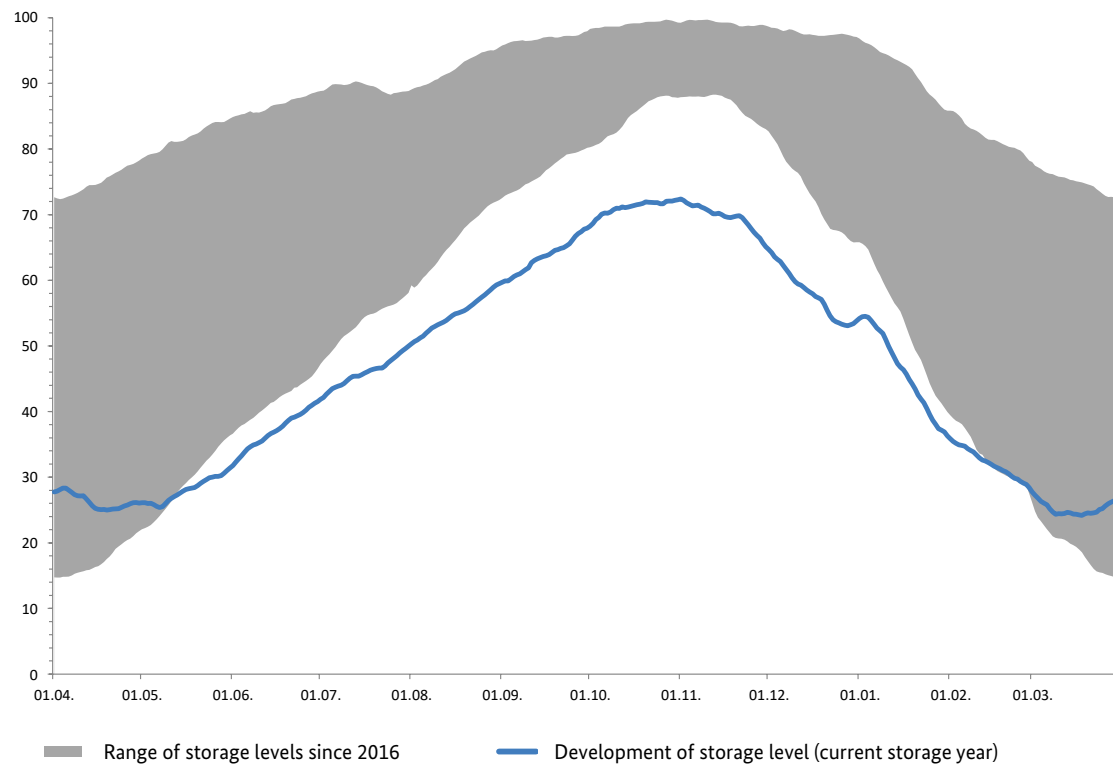


2. Storage levels

- On 31 March 2022, around 0.6 TWh was withdrawn from storage overall
- 31 March 2022: 63.94 TWh (26.3%)
[18 March 2022: 58.88 TWh (24.2%), 1 March 2022: 67.57 TWh (27.8%), 1 February 2022: 87.37 TWh (35.9%)]
- Since 18 March 2022, more gas has been injected into storage than withdrawn from it overall
- Current storage levels are comparable with those in 2021 and 2017 and now significantly higher than in winter 2018
